CLEANING AND DISINFECTION

- Sterile saline solution (wound irrigation)
HIGH
Preferred over hydrogen peroxide for most wounds
- Antiseptic wipes (individually wrapped)
HIGH
- Antiseptic solution or cream (e.g. Savlon, Betadine)
HIGH
- Wound wash spray

DRESSINGS

- Adhesive plasters (assorted sizes)
HIGH
- Sterile gauze pads (various sizes)
HIGH
- Non-adherent dressings (e.g. Melolin)
HIGH
Will not stick to the wound surface
- Foam dressings (for exuding wounds)
- Hydrocolloid dressings (e.g. for blisters)
- Medical adhesive tape / surgical tape
HIGH
- Crepe / conforming bandages
HIGH
- Wound closure strips / steri-strips
For closing small cuts without stitches
- Compression bandage

TOOLS

- Nitrile gloves (disposable)

HIGH

Always wear gloves when treating wounds

- Sterile scissors

HIGH

- Sterile tweezers / forceps

HIGH

For removing debris or splinters

- Thermometer (to monitor infection signs)

- Magnifying glass (for detailed wound inspection)

ADVANCED CARE

- Wound care gel (e.g. Manuka honey gel)

Supports healing in chronic or slow-healing wounds

- Silver dressings (for infected wounds)

Consult a nurse or GP before using

- Disposable apron

DOCUMENTATION

- Wound care record / dressing log

Track dressing changes, wound size, and any signs of infection
